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# Crawford Lake

This 468 hectare park includes unique geological features, extensive forests, a rare meromictic lake, and a 15th century reconstructed Iroquoian village. The conservation area has significant natural habitat with a wide diversity of flora and fauna and approximately 19 kilometres of nature trails. The trails consist of a series of overlapping loops and a connecting trail to the Rattlesnake Point Conservation Area. Interpretive stations are located on the boardwalk surrounding Crawford Lake and at the Niagara Escarpment lookout.

### Conservation Trail Ethics

Trails are routed to protect neighbouring environmentally sensitive areas. Trail routes are selected to mitigate damage to animal and plant species.

**Please stay on trails and do not cut new trails.**

The cliffs of the Niagara Escarpment can be hazardous and quite slippery when wet. Please be careful when hiking the trails at Crawford Lake.
